Recognising the creation or commercialisation of an innovative **product** that benefits business and / or broader community.

### **IMAKE - EMERGING INNOVATION**

For applicants in the early stages of development (patented or not patented).

### **IMAKE - ESTABLISHED INNOVATION**

For applicants in the later stages of development (product on the market, available to users and/or an existing customer base).

## **ISHAPE AWARDS**

Recognising the creation or commercialisation of an innovative process, procedure or service that benefits business and / or broader community.

### **ISHAPE - EMERGING INNOVATION**

For applicants in the early stages of development (patented or not patented).

### **ISHAPE - ESTABLISHED INNOVATION**

For applicants in the later stages of development (product on the market or actively in use).

## **INNOVATION AWARD**

Recognising the creation or commercialisation of an innovative **product or process** that delivers specific environmentally sustainable benefits to the region.

## **iBLOOM - SUSTAINABLE iDEVELOP - INDIGENOUS INNOVATION AWARD**

Recognising the creation or commercialisation of an innovative **product or process** by an Indigenous organisation or individual.

# **IVOTE - PEOPLE'S CHOICE AWARD**

Awarded to recognise a product or process based on votes by the general public.

## **INSPIRE - MAYOR'S CHOICE AWARD**

Awarded by the Mayor to recognise a product or process that stands out due to quality of concept or implementation.

## IWIN

Each award winner receives a customised package of professional services to assist in further development and promotion of their innovation, valued at over \$2000.
